Issued:

State law requires a parent/guardian to cause their children, from age five until the attainment of their seventeenth birthday or graduation from high school, to attend regularly a public or private school. If a student is not six years of age on or before the first day of September in a particular school, the parent/guardian may elect for his/her child not to attend kindergarten. For this purpose, the parent/guardian must sign and provide to the a district a written document making such an election. The Board expects school-aged children to attend school regularly. The district shall develop procedures to implement this policy.
